FOURTH GRADE

- 1. Know and appreciate the Ten Commandments, the Beatitudes, and the Corporal and Spiritual Works of Mercy.**
 - A. Demonstrate an understanding of the Ten Commandments as the basis of our Covenant relationship with God.
 - B. Paraphrase and convey an understanding of the Ten Commandments in pictorial or written form.
 - C. List specific actions which portray the spirit of the Beatitudes.
 - D. List specific actions which demonstrate the Corporal and Spiritual Works of Mercy.
 - E. Be involved in parish and school activities that reflect the Beatitudes and Works of Mercy.
 - F. Connect saints and heroes to the Beatitudes and Works of Mercy and reflect and respond to their examples.

- 2. Utilize Christian reasoning and apply moral values and ethical strategies for decision making.**
 - A. Apply knowledge of Commandments and Beatitudes to making moral (right) choices.
 - B. Describe the meaning of conscience and understand the need to form a conscience based on God's law.
 - C. Know and apply a decision making process involving knowledge of God's law, prayer, and personal reflection.

- 3. Participate in service projects and appreciate the need for action toward social justice.**
 - A. Make prayer cards for members of the OLG parish and school community.
 - B. Read, write, and respond to the meaning of service as it relates to sharing.
 - C. Demonstrate belief in sharing with others through food drives, Thanksgiving projects, the purchasing of Christmas gifts for those in need, and other school-wide service projects.

- 4. Participate in many forms of prayer opportunities.**
 - A. Participate in formal prayers: the Sign of the Cross, Hail Mary, Our Father, Glory Be, Angelus, and Prayer to the Holy Spirit.
 - B. Express the value and practice personal prayer, spontaneous prayer, contemplative prayer, Adoration of the Blessed Sacrament, and the Rosary.
 - C. Participate in the Eucharist.
 - D. Participate in seasonal and classroom paraliturgies.
 - E. Understand that prayer forms our personal relationship with God.
